Entries accepted only via BROE. Entries open: Sunday Evening 22nd May. Entries close: Wednesday 1st June at 10.00pm, unless suspended earlier.

Fees: Senior Events 1x: £15, 2x/2-: £30, 4+/4-/4x+/4x-: £60, 8+: £120. Junior events 1x: £12, 2x: £24, 4+/4-/4x+/4x-: £48, 8+, 8x+: £96.

Draw: Will take place on Sunday 6th June. Where practicable draw will be seeded based on crew rowing index however lanes and byes will be allocated randomly. If variations are required the Regatta Committee's decision is final.

Prize Giving: Prizes giving will take place on Sunday 12th June at 8pm at the Gala Theatre in Durham.

Course: Saturday: Short Course 700m, Sunday: Short Course 700m, Long Course 1800m

Double Entries: Competitors/Crews/Coxes/Equipment may only enter one event per division. Clubs entering two or more entries in the same event, must use the Crew A/B/C/D options on BROE to designate the order of priority for their crews.

Junior Entries: Please prioritise juniors into junior events. In a situation where a senior event is oversubscribed, senior crews will have priority. In the case of a junior crew entered in a senior event, where permitted they may be placed into a junior event of the same boat type in the same division.

Entry Limits: The Regatta Committee reserves the right to limit entries to particular events or to the regatta as a whole. Places for single, double and pairs crews in particular are expected to be limited and the Regatta will prioritise entries from the best scullers/crews from individual clubs. In the event that the regatta reaches its entry limits, entries will normally be accepted in priority order at the discretion of the organising committee.

Minimum Numbers: Changes due to insufficient entries will be notified via BROE. Club Secretaries should review proposed changes prior to the draw.

Event banding: The Regatta Committee will band events where necessary to split the competition into individual knockout events with prizes awarded to the winners of each band. The new competition framework makes it difficult to predict banding but the intention is that there will be a similar split of events within each boat type as in previous years under the old points system. Our general guidance is that we expect beginner/intermediate crews (Saturday) to be below an average per-competitor PRI of 50 (i.e. a coxed four will be below 200 CRI). On Sunday we expect that Non-Championship competitors to be below an average per-competitor PRI of 100 (i.e. 8+ will be below 800 CRI). There is no minimum CRI for Elite (Saturday) or Championship (Sunday) entries but any inappropriate entries may be rejected.

Masters Events: Masters events will use the masters handicap system where appropriate.

Crew Experience: All crews and competitors should be deemed competent to both attach to a stakeboat and race by the entering club

Junior: The Saturday J15 1x and J16 1x Open and Women's events will be the "Durham Regatta Junior Sculling Championships"

College: The College Championship Fours (Sunday) and College Maiden Novice Fours (Saturday) are for Durham University College crews only.

Para/Adaptive events will be offered depending on entries. We will combine classes using a handicap start system if insufficient entries are received in a particular para/rowability classification. Please contact us as soon as possible to discuss requirements.

Cancellation: In the event of cancellation or suspension of the regatta the committee will endeavour to refund 50% of entry fees, where crews have not raced, after unavoidable costs have been covered.

The regatta will be held under the British Rowing Rules of Racing. In Addition, Durham Regatta will follow: British Rowing Managing Covid-19, Advice for the Rowing Community, relevant government and county council guidance.

Note. The British Rowing membership insurance is only valid for UK residents who are resident in this country for more than six months in a year.
