Course: Stern-on stakeboat start. Saturday: Short Course 700m, Sunday Non-Championship: Short Course 700m; Sunday Championship (*): Long Course 1800m.

Crew Experience: All crews and competitors should be deemed competent to both attach to a stakeboat and race by the entering club.

Rules: The regatta will be held under the British Rowing Rules of Racing. In addition, Durham Regatta will follow relevant government and County Council guidance. Details of supplementary local rules are available from the Regatta Website. <https://durham-regatta.org.uk/>

Draw: Where practicable, the draw will be seeded based on crew ranking index, however, lanes and byes will be allocated randomly. If variations are required, the Organising Committee's decision is final. The Draw will be published on the Durham Regatta website.

Prize Giving: The presentation of prizes will take place on Sunday the 15th June at 8pm in the Marquee at Durham ARC.

Cancellation: In the event of cancellation or suspension of the regatta, the committee will endeavour to refund 50% of entry fees, where crews have not raced, after unavoidable costs have been covered.



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Entries Supporting Information

Junior: The Saturday J15 1x and J16 1x Open and Women's events will be the "Durham Regatta Junior Sculling Championships".

College: The College Championship Fours and College Novice Fours are for Durham University College crews only. College Novice Fours is limited to rowers who have taken up the sport after 1st June of the preceding academic year. Crews must have competed in a previous BR event and successfully completed the stakeboat practice test on the afternoon of Friday 13th June. Crews who do not pass the stakeboat test may not be allowed to race at the regatta.

Para/Adaptive: Para/Adaptive events will be offered depending on entries. The Organising Committee may combine classes using a handicap start system if insufficient entries are received in a particular para/rowability classification. Please contact us as soon as possible to discuss requirements.

Masters: Masters events will use the masters handicap system where appropriate.

Entries: Entries will be open on Sunday 11th May and remain open until Sunday 18th May. The official close of entries will be on Monday 2nd June. All entries received by Sunday 18th May will be considered. In the event of oversubscription, no priority will be given to crews entered earlier.

Double Entries: Competitors/Crews/Coxes/Equipment may only enter one event per division. Clubs entering two or more entries in the same event must use the Crew A/B/C/D options on BROE to designate the order of priority for their crews.

Junior Entries: Please prioritise entering juniors into junior events on Saturday. In a situation where a senior event is oversubscribed, senior crews will have priority. In the case of a junior crew entered in a senior event, where permitted, they may be placed into a junior event of the same boat type in the same division.

Minimum Numbers: Changes due to insufficient entries will be notified via BROE. Club Secretaries should review proposed changes prior to the draw.

Event Banding: The Organising Committee will band events where necessary to split the event into individual knockout events with prizes awarded to the winners of each band. There is no minimum CRI for Elite (Saturday) or Championship (Sunday) entries, but any inappropriate entries may be rejected.

Entry Limits: The Organising Committee reserves the right to limit entries to particular events and/or to the regatta as a whole. Places for single, double and pairs crews in particular are expected to be limited, and the Organising Committee will prioritise entries from the best scullers/crews. In the event that the regatta reaches its entry limits, entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Organising Committee. Please use the notes function on BROE to provide any supporting information deemed necessary, such as an under-pointed crew. The Organising Committee may consider the following criteria as part of that decision:

- Crew designation on BROE (A/B/C/D....)
- Crew Ranking Index
- Number of entries from the club in that event
- Number of entries of crew members into the regatta
- Payment received for the crew, or communication received explaining any delay
- Suitability of crew for the event entered
- Total number of entries in the event

Successful Entries: The Organising Committee will notify crews of successful entries through accepting crews on BROE.

Unsuccessful Entries: The Organising Committee will notify crews of unsuccessful entries through rejecting crews on BROE.

Wait list: A small number of crews will be placed on a wait list, signified within the division entered on BROE. In the event that crews withdraw before the completion of the draw, crews on the wait list may be accepted into the regatta to take their place. In this case, the crew will be notified through acceptance and changing division on BROE.

Entry Enquiries: Any enquiries into the entry process or decisions should be sent via email to entries@durham-regatta.org.uk listing the crew name, event entered, and the BROE crew ID number when relevant. Please be aware that the closer to the regatta, the busier the entries team will be. Any enquiries about entry decisions must be received within 72 hours of the official close of entries (Monday 2nd June) from the Pre-competition Contact listed on BROE.
